

Revision Clocks

What is it?

- Revision clocks allow pupils to break whole topics into sections and place on 1 piece of paper
- Each hour represents a theme or sub topic of the overall subject e.g. Maths – Hour 1 = Long Division, Hour 2 = Pythagoras Theorem

How does it work?

- Pupils are to read over their revision resources, exercise books, website etc.
- Then select key information and place it into the key section
- Ideally pupils should limit the word use to no more than 10 per section and use images or pictures to replace the need for words.
- Once complete, pupils spend time explaining aloud what each section means; they have to do this aloud for it to work

Why?

- The selecting and breaking down of information ensures they understand the topics
- The use of images makes the revision personalised and allows them to visualise the revision clock in the actual exam
- All the information is on one single piece of information
- The speaking aloud to self helps the brain remember
